


This easy-to-make project provides an attractive way to transport a hot casserole dish from the kitchen to the dinner table. It can be put right on the table since it also serves to protect the table from the hot dish. Ours is made from red oak along with birch dowel stock, but just about any wood species can be used. Very little stock is required, so check your scrap bin before starting. Also, those looking for a marketable item might want to consider this one.

The dimensions we've provided are based on using a Pyrex 33 x 23 x 5 cm. dish. If a different size dish is used,

Cut the two 3/4 x 25/8 x 11 end pieces and the two 3/4 x 1 x 11 handles to size. Locate and drill the ½ inch diameter dowel holes as shown, then cut the dowel stock to length. Sand smooth before gluing and clamping. When dry apply a slight chamfer to all edges of the ends and handles. Use a sharp chisel to clean up any excess glue squeeze-out. An application of Watco Clear Danish Oil will complete the project.
